1. 2012 Chair's report: Please provide a narrative of the past year's activity/successes/challenges:*	Challenges Economic uncertainty and increased worker insecurity continue to challenge the way the local section can operate. At a time when employers continue to put high demands on their workers, few chemists are willing or abl to become or remain a member of ACS. The ripple effect of downsizing and mergers are still being felt in the community. Even though it is difficult to maintain the same membership level these days, we welcomed an increase in volunteerism by non-members; many of them were students. The chair's goals were as follows in 2012: 1) To increase student participation 2) To offer KACS to its members and the general public 3) To educate the general public about the goals and activities of KACS
	Activities The local section organized approximately the same number of activities although there were some notable differences. For example, there were two specialized MS User Group activities this year compared to last year. However, this year, each event had industry sponsors. A new event, "Boost Your Career", targeted especially early career and aspiring chemists. Two new social events wer organized via a nano and IPG grant, which also involved several new donors and co-sponsors.
	Successes There were some notable successes. With the goal of being more responsive to the interests of others, including students, a concerted effort was made to include representatives during EC meetings and to incorporate them during KACS activities. NOBCChE (WMU Chapter of the National Organization for the Professional Advancement of Black Chemists and Chemical Engineers joined the table along with three ACS-affiliated student groups - the K-College and WMU ChemClubs and CGSA a WMU graduate association. The "Boost Your Career" event attracted 70 people for a panel discussion and wine and cheese reception, which was a lively mix of chemistry students, college instructors and chemists from local industries. Student organizations were invited to participate with displays or posters during several events (career, dance, and poster events).
	The local section was consistent in organizing yet anothe successful NCW "Chemistry Day" at the museum event with the help of 57 volunteers, which attracted 727 patrons. A real surprise was the great turnout of 179 people to join the "Elements of Dance" event at the Kalamazoo Institute of Arts to observe a "fun reaction" from "mixing chemistry and dancing". The poster session of 2011 was repeated again this year with the support of Pfizer Animal Health. Four student groups were exited to participate with displays and posters during the "Boost Your Career" event and to interact with visitors from the chemical industry.
	Communication was improved with the support of talenter people: our newsletter editor David Bolliet, a new photographer volunteer – Melissa Basileo, and our web master Steve Bertman. A new Facebook page was launched to help promote our events. This year the newsletter publication included event flyers and other alerts that helped improve dissemination of information to the membership. KACS publications and online postings included many more event photos (70 in 2012 compared to 7 in 2011) and reports to make chemistry, chemists an KACS appear more approachable and responsive to its members.
	KACS welcomed the news that Cassie Kiewiet, an 11th grade student from Heritage Christian Academy in Kalamazoo, who was the first-place winner in the grades -12 category of the National Illustrated Poem contest on our 2012 National Chemistry Week theme [open to K-12 students in all 189 Local Sections of the Society during through the month of October].

A major goal was to communicate with KACS members and non-members effectively about the goals and activities in our local section. This was accomplished by focusing on our newsletter publications and on our online postings. In addition we created a new Facebook page. All of these helped improve communication and provided avenues for members to get in touch with the local leadership. Many events were announced online and via email alerts to our newsletter link. We also recruited a new volunteer photographer. Documentation of KACS-related activities was instrumental. The inclusion of member-related events and associated photos was meant to create more interest in KACS and to make chemistry more personal. In the end, it did create more enthusiasm that helped us identify many volunteers. The newsletters took on a very appealing and professional look; the number of photos increased from 7 in 2011 to 70 in 2012. We had consistent participation from chemists in local industry and from local college students. During executive committee meetings we often had one to four student representatives. The section applied for funding through a nano grant in addition to an ambitious IPG grant. The latter involved

collaborations with several donors and co-sponsors. For the first time we received funding from AAAS, Kalsec, Aldrich-Chemistry, VWR, and WMU-BTR, for a total of \$1750. The event titled "Elements of Dance" turned out to be a great success and attracted 179 people, the second highest turnout for an event in recent history. Event participants enjoyed socializing during this and other events. Along those lines a new "Boost Your Career" event attracted 70 people for a panel discussion and wine and cheese reception on WMU's campus. The event was a lively mix of chemistry students, college instructors and chemists from local industries. Student organizations were invited to participate with displays or posters during several events (career, dance, and poster events).
